Business Impact Group and Chief Information Officers Advisory Committee Communique – 12 October 2016

The third combined meeting of the Business Impact Group and CIO Advisory Committee was held on Wednesday 12 October 2016 at Dumas House.

Members considered the following matters:

GovNext-ICT Benefits Realisation Management Strategy

A whole-of-government benefits realisation approach is proposed to measure the benefits of GovNext-ICT, and to assist agencies plan their transition into GovNext-ICT. Committee members were supportive of a whole-of-government benefits realisation approach. The Strategy is currently open for feedback with Committee members.

Government Strategic ICT Capability Maturity Matrix

An ALPHA version of a Capability Maturity Matrix (CMM) has been developed to support agencies' maturity in the *Digital WA*'s strategic capabilities, and to measure the changes in maturity of the sector as a whole.

Committee members agreed that the matrix provides a good starting point, and the pilot will test the practicality and effectiveness of the model.

Members supported and endorsed the Government Strategic ICT Capability Maturity Matrix and the commencement of BETA testing.

WA Data Classification Policy

Members discussed the importance of the Western Australian Data Classification Policy. The policy is a decision making process to determine the security level and controls required for an agency's data and information. The policy provides the minimum protection levels required to ensure integrity of government data, and provides consistency in the language and terms used.

Members agreed that the draft policy and guide provided a good starting point for data classification.

Members endorsed the WA Government Data Classification policy and the Guide to the WA Government Data Classification Policy.

Next Steps
